**RESTON FELLOWSHIP FOUNDATION RECEIVES MOBIL FOUNDATION GIFT**

RESTON, VA. - November 30 - Reston Land Corporation Executive Vice President Thomas J. D'Alesandro IV this week presented a Mobil Foundation check for \$1,000 to the Board of Fellowship Square Foundation, Inc. (FSFI) which is preparing for their thirtieth anniversary in 1990.

Present owner and operator of five Fellowship Houses for independent living in Reston, Woodbridge, VA. and Upper Marlboro, MD., FSFI was created by the Lutheran Laymen's Fellowship in 1960 as a non-profit organization for the special purpose of providing adequate housing for low to moderate income elderly.

Spearheaded by the tireless and inspired leadership of Dr. John A. Sherzer (now over 80 and still at his desk each day), FSFI built its first Reston Fellowship House at Lake Anne Village in 1972. Since then, they have built two more elderly high rise facilities adjacent to Hunters Woods and Tall Oaks Village Centers.

Opened a year ago, the Tall Oaks Fellowship House is the first Home for Adults sponsored by FSFI that gives additional assistance to the elderly and handicapped who are unable to continue to live independently.

At the ceremony, FSFI President, Dr. C. David Hartmann, and Executive Director Leo E. Berger presented D'Alesandro with a Certificate of Appreciation for the many years that Mobil has contributed to this group which has helped fulfill Reston's unique goal of providing housing for incomes and ages of all levels.

They also presented D'Alesandro with a recently published book (by Reston's Red Brick Press) - A MISSION TO SERVE - an autobiography of Dr. Scherzer's eight decades of dedication to helping the elderly and less fortunate - written by Red Brick Publisher Jack Erickson.

Hartmann told D'Alesandro that FSFI is now waiting for Reston Land Corporation's plans for the fifth, and final, village center (North Point) so they can start designing Reston's fourth Fellowship House. RLC is expected to break ground for North Point Village Center in 1991.
